

Art Raffle for International Women's Day

(Terms & Conditions – based on Small Society Lottery regulations)

1. Promoter

This lottery is promoted by Beyond the Streets, a registered charity in England and Wales (Charity No. 1178421) with its registered office at 302 The Highway London, E1W 3DH.

The Charity is registered with London Borough Tower Hamlets to operate a Small Society Lottery under the Gambling Act 2005 (Registration No. 185686).

2. Purpose of the Lottery

This lottery is being run to raise funds in support of the Charity's charitable objectives.

3. Eligibility

3.1 Entry is open to persons aged 18 years or over at the time of purchase.

3.2 By purchasing a ticket, you confirm that you are 18 years of age or older.

3.3 The Charity reserves the right to request proof of age and identity before awarding any prize.

3.4 Trustees, employees, and any third parties directly involved in the administration of the lottery are not eligible to enter.

3.5 The lottery is open to residents of the United Kingdom only.

4. Ticket Purchase

4.1 Tickets cost £10 each.

4.2 Tickets may only be purchased online via the Charity's official website [here](#).

4.3 Payment must be made in full at the time of purchase via the approved payment methods shown on the website.

4.4 Each ticket purchased will be assigned a unique number.

4.5 Tickets are non-transferable and non-refundable, except in the event of cancellation of the draw.

5. Raffle Ticket Reference Number

5.1 Assignment of Reference Number

Upon purchasing raffle tickets, each ticket will be assigned a unique reference number. This Reference Number will be provided to the purchaser for the purpose of identifying the ticket(s) in the raffle draw.

5.2 Multiple Ticket Purchases

In the event that multiple tickets are purchased in a single transaction, each individual ticket will still be assigned the same unique Reference Number. The Reference Number will then be followed by a suffix to differentiate each ticket for the draw. For example, if two tickets are purchased, the Reference Numbers assigned will be as follows:

- First ticket: [Unique Reference Number]01
- Second ticket: [Unique Reference Number]02

This process will apply to all ticket purchases, where the suffix will correspond to the order in which tickets are purchased within that transaction.

5.3 Reference Number Usage

The Reference Number, including any suffix, will be used to identify the ticket(s) for the purposes of the raffle draw and the awarding of prizes. Purchasers should retain their Reference Number as proof of their participation and the number of tickets entered.

5.4 Explanation of Key Terms:

- **Unique Reference Number:** This is the primary number assigned to the ticket.
- **Suffix:** This is an additional identifier (e.g., 01, 02, etc.) that is added to distinguish between multiple tickets purchased in one transaction

6. Draw Details

6.1 The closing date for ticket sales is Sunday 8th March at midnight.

6.2 The draw will take place on Tuesday 10th March.

6.3 Winners will be selected at random using independent random number generator.

6.4 The result of the draw is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

7. Prizes

7.1 Prize Nomination Requirement

At the time of purchasing a ticket, and when prompted to do so, each entrant may select and submit three (3) preferred prize options in order of preference (first, second, and third choice). The entrant's submitted preferences will be recorded at the time of entry and cannot be amended after the ticket purchase has been completed.

7.2 Prize Allocation Process

If an entrant's ticket is selected in the draw, the charity will allocate a prize in accordance with the entrant's recorded order of preference. In the event that all of the entrant's nominated prizes have already been allocated to previously drawn tickets, the promoter will award the highest-value remaining prize available at the time of allocation. If no preferences were selected at time of purchase, the prize awarded will be the highest-value remaining prize available at the time of allocation.

7.3 The prizes available are as follows:

- Artwork by Mr Cenz called Skyward (40cm x 50cm) - Artist's valuation: £2,500
- Artwork by Abraham O called LOTUS (24in x 30in) – Artist's valuation: £1,200
- Artwork by Dave called Fragmented Spot No.7 and Fragmented Spot No.4 (both 36in x 24in) - Artist's valuation: £700 each (Total valuation = £1,400)

- Artwork by Mul unnamed x 2 (70cm x 100cm) – Artist’s valuation: £650 each (Total valuation = £1,300)
- Artwork by Prefab77 called House and House II (smaller than 100cm x 100cm) - Artist’s valuation: £500 each (Total valuation = £1,000)
- Artwork by Haurel called RESILIENCE (smaller than 100cmx100cm) – Artist’s valuation: £600
- Artwork by 7th Pencil Live for the Dying called RESILIENCE (100cm x 100cm) – Artist’s valuation: £500
- Artwork by ConsumerSmith called Fortitude in Gold (100cm x 100cm) - Artist’s valuation: £475
- Artwork by Shauna Blanchfield called Misneach (35cm x 45cm) – Artist’s valuation: £350
- Artwork by Shauna Blanchfield called A diary of Community x 4 (20cm x 25cm each) - Artist’s valuation: £50 each (Total valuation £200)
- Artwork by Elna called 'Embracing wonder within' (40cm x 50cm framed print) – Artist’s valuation: £110
- Artwork by Beat13 called 'Nowhere' (A5 print) – Artist’s valuation: £100
- Artwork by Curiouser and Curiouser called 'Embracing wonder within' (A5 prints) – Artist’s valuation: £15 each (Total valuation = £45)
- Artwork by Beat13 named 'Exclusive Print' (50cm x 50cm) – Artist’s valuation: TBC

7.4 The value of the artwork prizes indicated above reflect the valuation by the artist of the artwork at time of donation to the charity and are a guide only.

7.5 The Charity accepts no responsibility for any fluctuation, depreciation, or change in the market value of any raffle prize and shall not be liable to make up any shortfall or difference in value arising from such change.

7.6 Prizes are non-transferable and no cash alternative will be offered.

7.7 The Charity reserves the right to substitute a prize with another of equal or greater value if necessary.

8. Notification of Winners

8.1 Winners will be notified by email and/or telephone within 7 days of the draw.

8.2 If a winner cannot be contacted within 21 days, the Charity reserves the right to redraw the prize.

8.3 Winners may be required to provide proof of age and identity before a prize is awarded.

8.4 A list of winners' surnames and counties may be published on the Charity's website unless a winner objects.

9. Delivery of Raffle Prizes

9.1 Geographical Limitation

The delivery of raffle prizes is **limited to the United Kingdom** only. Prizes will be shipped or delivered by the charity to a valid address within the UK. We do not deliver to international locations.

9.2 Shipping Costs Covered by the Charity

The charity will cover the cost of standard shipping for the prize up to a maximum amount of £20. This amount will cover the standard delivery charges for shipping the prize to the winner's provided UK address.

9.3 Excess Shipping Costs

If the shipping cost exceeds the amount covered by the charity, the winner will be responsible for covering the additional cost. The winner will be notified of the excess shipping amount and will be required to pay the additional charge before the prize is dispatched. The winner has 21 days to make the necessary payment from acknowledgment of awarded prize. If the payment is not received within this timeframe, the prize may be forfeited, and a new winner may be selected.

9.4 Liability and Damage in Transit

Beyond the Streets shall not be liable for any loss, delay, or damage to artwork or any other prize occurring during shipping or delivery. All prizes are dispatched at the winner's risk.

9.5 Shipping Insurance and Additional Cover

Standard shipping arranged by Beyond the Streets may not include insurance for damage or loss beyond basic carrier liability. If the winner wishes to insure the artwork or prize against damage, loss, or additional transit risks, any additional insurance costs or enhanced shipping protection must be paid in full by the winner prior to dispatch. Beyond the Streets will provide details of any optional insurance costs upon request.

9.6 Prize Delivery

Once shipping costs have been confirmed and any required payments received, the charity will aim to deliver the prize within 14 days of payment. Delivery times may vary depending on the prize, location, and shipping provider.

10. Use of Proceeds

10.1 This lottery is conducted as a Small Society Lottery in accordance with the Gambling Act 2005.

10.2 For a Small Society Lottery at least 20% of the proceeds of the lottery will be

applied to the Charity's purposes, this excludes administration costs for running the raffle.

10.3 The total proceeds of this lottery will not exceed £20,000 and total proceeds from lotteries run by the Charity in a calendar year will not exceed £250,000.

11. Responsible Gambling

11.1 The Charity is committed to responsible gambling.

12. Data Protection

12.1 The Charity will process personal data in accordance with UK data protection legislation.

12.2 Personal data will be used for the administration of this lottery and in accordance with the Charity's Privacy Policy available at <https://beyondthestreets.org.uk/policies-accounts/>

12.3 Data will not be shared with third parties except where necessary to administer the lottery or where required by law.

13. Cancellation or Amendment

The Charity reserves the right to cancel or amend the lottery or these Terms & Conditions where necessary due to circumstances beyond its reasonable control. In the event of cancellation, ticket holders will receive a full refund.

14. Limitation of Liability

The Charity shall not be liable for any loss arising from technical failures, network issues, or other circumstances beyond its control. Nothing in these Terms limits liability for death or personal injury caused by negligence or for fraud.

15. Governing Law

These Terms & Conditions are governed by the laws of England and Wales and are subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
